Cadet Winton selection criteria.

Current Criteria

The current criteria is based on the cadet/junior/senior rankings as well as LPJS. Cadet rankings given priority followed by LPJS. Selections past these ranking based on merit.

Suggested Criteria

The selection for the Cadet Winton will be based on the following criteria:

Cadet ranking
LPJS U15
The Youth Series U16
LPJS U13
The Youth Series U14

Where fencers are equally ranked, priority will be given to the fencer who has attended the regional training sessions on a regular basis and who will be in their last year of U17 competitions.

Timings

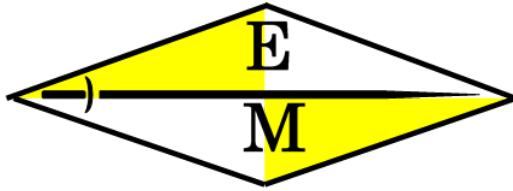
Invitations will be sent out to parents of invited fencers starting from the end of September. Team fencers are heavily encouraged to attend the regional training session.

Team members

Teams of 4 will be selected.

Parents/Guardians are expected to arrange transport to the venue. Parents are welcome to stay for the weekend at extra charge but must have a valid current DBS certificate to stay on-site.

Eligibility

To be eligible for selection fencers must meet one of the following criteria:

- 1) Have been born within the region
- 2) Permanently or normally reside within the region. This includes living within a region for education
- 3) Are a member of an East Midlands fencing club affiliated with British Fencing from the 1st of January
- 4) Registered as a member of the region on their British Fencing membership
- 5) Previously represented East Midlands without fencing for another region in the intervening time

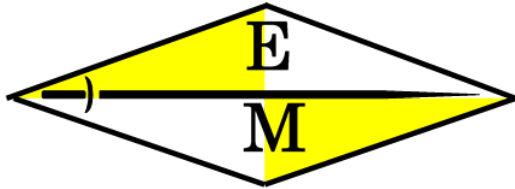

Senior Winton selection criteria.

Current Criteria

The top 2 fencers from the Senior ranking list are invited as a priority. The manager and the EM committee can make discretionary selections where necessary. Secondary selection criteria are: BUCs championship results, Junior rankings, Veteran rankings, and Cadet rankings.

Suggested Criteria

U17 and Veteran fencers already have their own Winton events. Therefore, EM selection will be prioritised to fencers aged between 17 and 39.

The selection for the Senior Winton will be based on the following criteria:

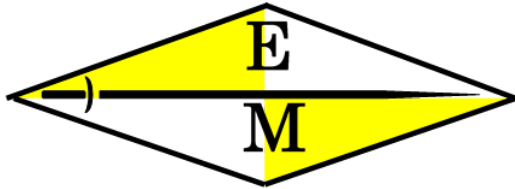
- 1st and 2nd fencers: Senior rankings
- 3rd and 4th fencers: Discretionary based on the following
 - Senior Ranking
 - BUCs Championships
 - U23 Championships
 - Junior Ranking
 - Veteran Ranking
 - Cadet Ranking

The 3rd and 4th places on the team will be decided by ranking the fencers based on the ranking lists outlined. This will then be sent to the EM committee for agreement. The committee can make suggestions to the invite order. Fencers at the top of this list will be invited first, working down the list. Where fencers are similarly ranked, priority will be given to fencers who have attended the regional training sessions.

Timings

Invitations will be sent out to the first two fencers following the publication of the January Rankings. The 3rd and 4th fencer will be invited beginning of April, following the BUCs Championship in March, and using the April Senior Rankings.
